We are pleased to provide you with our 2023 Orange Village Recycling Calendar filled with recycling tips and opportunities. Orange Village received a grant from the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District for the printing of this informative calendar.

Recycling has certainly changed over the years. We began by recycling paper and cardboard at dropoff bins. We progressed to blue bags and small containers for certain items. Currently we are able to commingle all the recyclable items in 64 gallon recycle containers. Items that we are able to place in the container are constantly changing. This calendar provides a great deal of information including what items can still be recycled in your container and what items can no longer be placed in your recycle container. Please note that all information stated in the calendar was correct at the time of printing and may be subject to change. We will keep you updated on new information via our electronic newsletters. Please take the time to review this information.

As always, I continue to encourage all residents to recycle as much as possible, not only in your recycle container but also with composting bins, grasscycling and repurposing of items. We also offer a metal recycle container at Orange Village Service Department (by the salt shed) for ferrous and non-ferrous metals. The container is marked with a sign under the overhang. It is for "Metals only" - no other trash or products. This program allows us to reduce landfill costs and save the environment.

In 2021, Orange Village residents diverted over 364 tons of recyclable materials from the landfill. This effort saved the Village almost \$13,000. I would like to thank all of the residents for increasing your recycling efforts. Everyone reaps the long-term benefits of recycling.

Container Rental Service Offered

Orange Village will drop off a 6, 8, 10 or 12 yard container during the months of April through November (weather permitting) to help dispose of brush, yard waste, construction debris or household debris.



You cannot mix items in the container but you can choose from several different types of materials to dispose of. Rental costs vary depending on container size and items to be discarded.

Curbside Refuse and Recycling Collection

Orange Village provides weekly curbside collection of refuse and recyclables through its contract with Kimble Recycling & Disposal, Inc. All material is collected from your home on the same day.

Collection for Orange Village is on **Monday** except when certain holidays fall on a Monday, then collection will take place on Tuesday. Below is a list of holidays that will change our collection day:

• **Memorial Day, Monday, May 29** • **Labor Day, Monday, September 4** • **Christmas Day, Monday, December 25**

Pick up will be: • **Tuesday, May 30**

• **Tuesday, September 5**

• **Tuesday, December 26**

Ordinance 939.02

- Refuse and recyclables **must be placed on the tree lawn near the street before 7:00 a.m. on the day of collection.**
- Trash containers are not to be placed curbside prior to 4:00 p.m. on the day before any scheduled collection day.
- All containers must be removed from the curbside prior to 10:00 a.m. the day after any scheduled collection day.
- All perishable trash placed curbside should be placed in a container which is not susceptible to being opened or destroyed by animals.

Placement of Your Refuse and Recycling Containers

Please place your containers 2 feet from the street with the lid opening facing the street and 3 feet from other objects. Please place your recycling on one side of your driveway and trash can on the other. We have noticed that some residents are not placing their cans out prior to **7:00 a.m.** on Monday mornings. It is imperative that you place your cans out on time. The pickup route for Kimble has been known to change from week to week.



If you have a new home, please contact Village Hall at 440-498-4400 to establish service and schedule delivery of your containers.

ASSISTANCE WITH PLACING YOUR CANS AT THE STREET



If you have difficulty taking your trash and recycle containers to the street on a weekly basis and are willing to pay a nominal fee to have this accomplished, please contact Anna Girardi at 440-287-5131. Orange Village has the names of vendors that provide this service, for a fee. The Village does not endorse or investigate any company that offers this service. We will provide the vendor information to the resident. If any party desires to provide this service for a fee, please contact Anna Girardi.

We must meet a minimum requirement of homes for participation in our community.

Inkjet and Laser Cartridges

Orange Village works in partnership with the Orange High School PTA during its campaign to recycle used inkjet and laser cartridges.

Drop off empty cartridges at Orange Village Hall, 4600 Lander Road, or any Orange School. By doing so you are making a genuine effort to improve

our planet as well as contribute funds to the Orange High School PTA.

Holiday Tree Recycling

Orange Village Service Department will be collecting your natural holiday trees on January 3, 9, 17, and 23. The trees will be chipped instead of using valuable space in the landfills. Please prepare your tree for collection by following these simple guidelines:

- * Place tree with trunk facing the road.
- * Remove lights, ornaments, tinsel and other trimmings from branches.
- * Remove tree stands, metal or wood.
- * Do not bag your tree.



Recycle Your Holiday Lights



Did you find strings of holiday lights that are old or no longer working? Orange Village Service Department will accept them on January 6 and 13, from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Drop off your old lights, power strips and power cords at the Orange Village Service Department Recycle Center, 4680 Lander Road, to be recycled. **DO NOT PLACE THEM IN YOUR CURBSIDE RECYCLE CONTAINER!**

Household Hazardous Waste, Escrap and Flags: First Friday of Every Month (7am to 3pm)

Orange Village Service Department will accept unwanted oil-based paint, pesticides, automotive fluid and other hazardous products found in your home as well as computer equipment and retired American flags. You can tell if a product is hazardous if words such as POISON, DANGER, WARNING and CAUTION appear on the label.

Antifreeze - If you are connected to a sanitary sewer, antifreeze may be diluted with water and flushed down an inside utility drain. Do not use an outside storm drain. ***If you use a septic system, do not flush antifreeze down any drain.*** It may be included in the household hazardous waste collection.

***How to decide if you have latex paint:** Look for "latex" on the label. If the paint is cleaned up with water, it is latex and can be disposed of in your regular trash collection as long as it is solidified first. See May for information on how to solidify the paint.

- Wood Preservatives

Do not put televisions and other electronics in your curbside recycling container. Best Buy stores will recycle televisions for a fee, currently the fee is \$29.99 per item. They will accept; tube TVs smaller than 32", Portable TVs, Flat-panel TVs: LCD, plasma, LED smaller than 50". Limit two TVs per household per day. Branch and Brush Collection

The Orange Village Service Department will be collecting branches and brush on April 17th, June 12th, July 17th and September 11th. This service is to aid the residents in the management of tree prunings and limbs that have fallen from their trees.

Brush Pickup Requirements

In an effort to provide residents with the highest level of service and to minimize the risk of injury to employees or damage to equipment, the following regulations will be strictly enforced:

- No foreign material (i.e. rope, metal, wood posts, construction wood, split rail fence, railroad ties or any material that could contain nails or metal, stumps and root balls).
- DO NOT mix leaves, grass clippings or yard material with branches.
- DO NOT place out any material with thorns.
- DO NOT make large piles.
- Limbs shall be placed with cut ends towards the road, no more than 2 feet high and 3 feet wide. Piles must be able to be picked up by one person.
- Long lengths are acceptable, if they can be handled by one person.
- Limbs should be no larger than 6" in diameter.
- Small material shorter than 2 feet in length shall be bundled or placed in a container.
- Branches should not be placed roadside any more than a few days before the scheduled chipping date. Branches must be out by 7:00 a.m. on the scheduled date. The Service Department makes one complete pass through the Village beginning on the scheduled day and ending once a complete pass of the Village has been made.
- Branches placed out too early or too late must be removed by the resident.

Non-compliance of these rules may result in non-removal of your material.

If you are removing a tree or having one removed, please dispose of the material in another way.

This service is not intended to chip complete trees.

Wood Chips... *Orange Village delivers the wood chips, that are collected during branch chipping, free of charge to residents. An approximate load size is 10 yards. Requests are honored in the order they are received, while supplies last. Place your order online at www.orangevillage.com or call Village Hall at 440-498-4400.*

This secure system eradicates all the information stored on your computer and protects your confidentiality. After the hard drive is cleaned, usable computer systems are remanufactured. Unrepairable equipment is completely deconstructed. If your donation does not meet school specifications, RET3 Job Corp. will recycle the equipment in a process that is fully compliant with EPA standards and offers a 100% no-landfill guarantee.

Miscellaneous Items for CURBSIDE TRASH Pickup

The following items may be placed at the curb on pickup day.

If the items are large, as a courtesy, please contact Kimble Refuse directly at 1-800-201-0005 to notify them of an “oversized” pick-up.

Latex Paint is a non-hazardous material and can be disposed of with your regular trash, **once it has been dried**. To dry or harden latex paint add sand, sawdust, plaster of paris, vermiculite, cat litter or a paint hardener (available at hardware stores). For small amount of latex paint (1” or less), remove the lid and allow paint to air dry. Place cans of latex paint curbside without the lids.



Syringes & Lancets must be disposed of safely. Place them in a “sharps container”, such as an empty 2 liter pop bottle or empty detergent bottle (labeled “SHARPS”). Secure the cap, then dispose with your regular **trash**.



Cooking Oils should not be disposed of down your drains. The oil should be collected in clear plastic containers that have been **clearly marked cooking oil** and disposed of in your household hazardous waste collection. Small amounts may be put in your trash after they are hardened with kitty litter to prevent fires or spills.



Lumber & Wood Building Materials must be cut into 4 foot lengths and bundled with non-metallic ties. Sheet rock (dry wall), must be cut into 4’ or less pieces, bundled and wrapped in plastic. Asphalt shingles will not be accepted. For safety, please remove all nails from any building materials. This is a service for our residents, it is not intended for use by contractors.



Household Appliances, such as washers, dryers, etc. will be picked up on your regular collection day. Doors must be removed from refrigerators/freezers.



Household Fixtures, such as bathtubs, utility tubs, toilets, kitchen sinks, etc. will be picked up on your regular collection day.



Ordinary household batteries, such as alkaline, may



be disposed of with your regular trash. Rechargeable batteries should be recycled at an approved battery recycling location such as Home Depot or Lowe’s (not curbside). Visit Call2Recycle.org for locations.

Furniture and Mattresses (mattresses must be covered in plastic and taped closed) should be placed on the curb on your regular collection day. Keep in mind you may also donate your gently-used furniture for reuse. Visit the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District’s website at www.cuyahogarecycles.org for more information.



Carpet & Padding will be taken on your regular collection day if it is neatly rolled or folded and tied in pieces no longer than 4 feet and weighing no more than 50 pounds and placed at the curb.

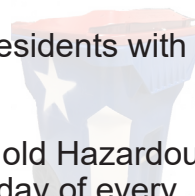

Retire American Flags

Orange Village Service Department provides residents with a bin to retire your American Flags.

You may drop your flags off during our Household Hazardous Waste/Computer Collection day on the first Friday of every month from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Service Department, 4680 Lander Road. Please place the flags in the specially marked container and they will be respectfully retired as stipulated in the time-honored code.



How To Dispose of Latex Paint

Orange Village does **not** accept latex paint in the Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Program because it is not a hazardous material. Latex paint (a.k.a. water-based, acrylic, or emulsion paint) is comprised mostly of water and can be safely disposed of in your household trash as long as it is solidified first. Listed below are ways to solidify latex paint:



- **Air dry.** Remove the lid and allow the liquid to evaporate. This works well for small quantities of paint (an inch or two in the bottom of the can), and can take several days.

- **Use a drying agent.** Mix an equal amount of an absorbent material into the can and allow the paint to dry. Use cat litter, sawdust, plaster of Paris, Oil-dri, or "waste paint hardeners" found at home improvement centers. The paint could dry quickly, depending on how much drying agent you include in the can.

- **Pour thin layers** (about 1" of paint) into a cardboard box lined with plastic. Allow the paint to dry one layer at a time until all paint has hardened.

Once the paint is thoroughly dry, place it next to your trash container, with the lid off, for Monday trash collection.

Medicine Disposal - Rx Drug Drop Box Program



Orange Village Police Department and Cuyahoga County are working to protect your home and the environment from potentially dangerous medications with the Rx Drug Drop Box Program.

Law enforcement is the only entity legally able to accept these medications and process them properly so that they do not fall into the wrong hands. Law enforcement takes control of and destroys drugs on a regular basis as part of their ongoing operations.

Applying compost to soil improves its texture, structure, aeration ability and water holding capacity. Trees, flowers or vegetables will grow healthier with less chemicals or fertilizers.

- An inexpensive way to improve the soil and reduce fertilizer requirements.
- Conserves natural resources such as water, organic matter and nutrients.
- An environmental friendly way to improve soil health and the health of plants.
- Reduces garden chores by applying compost like a mulch to limit weeds and retain moisture.
- Saves Orange Village on waste disposal fees.
- Combats climate change by decomposing organics with oxygen, preventing the release of methane gas when organics decompose without oxygen in a landfill.
- Reduces water pollution by reducing the need for fertilizers, which prevent algae blooms and kills fish in streams and lakes.

CFL Bulbs and Fluorescent Tubes



Compact fluorescent lamps and other energy-efficient lighting contain a very small amount of mercury. While mercury is a useful element with many applications, it can pose a threat to human health and the environment if thrown in the trash or flushed down a sink. All fluorescent bulbs should be recycled properly to protect public health and the environment. The Home Depot® and Lowe's Home Improvement offer free in-store recycling of consumer compact fluorescent light (CFL) bulbs, rechargeable batteries, and plastic bags in their stores.



Fluorescent tubes can be recycled at Batteries Plus Bulbs stores, for a nominal fee (\$.85 for tubes less than 4 feet and \$1.20 for 4-8 foot tubes). Residents may also contact Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District at (216) 443-3749 for alternate disposal options.

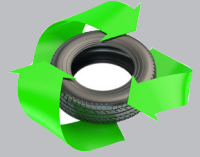

We can all be part of the solution to plastic pollution. Consider these tips to remember your reusable bags by choosing to #BYOBags when you shop.



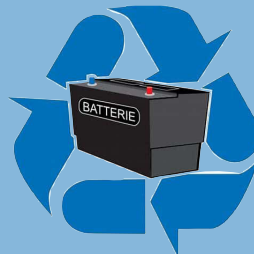
- 🌐 Write "Bags" at the top of your shopping list. Take a look at the list before you leave the house and prior to stepping out of your car at the store.
- 🌐 As soon as you unpack your groceries or other shopping, hang the empties by your front door so you remember to take them back out to the car.
- 🌐 Buckle them into the front passenger seat or somewhere visible from your front seat, so you don't forget.
- 🌐 Set a reminder or an alarm on your phone for shopping days.

- 🌐 Place a sticky note on your dashboard or instrument panel to remind you to take your bags into the store. Request a BYOBags vinyl window cling for your vehicle or home.
- 🌐 Stash a reusable nylon or canvas bag in your purse or backpack. They fold down to nothing.
- 🌐 Involve your kids. Put them in charge of helping you remember to have your special bags AND take them into the store.
- 🌐 It's easier to remember your bags if there are many options to choose from! Canvas, vinyl or cloth are a good choice. Find a design or color that matches your personality and purchasing habits. Plus, more bags mean more areas to strategically place them so you don't forget.
- 🌐 Set your bags by the door so you remember to take them to your car for your next shopping trip to the mall or for groceries.
- 🌐 Signs, signs, signs. Ask your favorite grocer or store to help you remember by posting helpful signs in the parking lot or at the entrance to the mall and retail space.

DISPOSAL OF VEHICLE BATTERIES

Lead acid batteries use these materials to retain a long-lasting and reliable charge. Both of these materials can pose a serious risk to the environment and your health. A sealed battery is safe to handle, but improperly disposing of a battery is dangerous. Ohio law prohibits the disposal of lead acid batteries in landfills. The law also requires wholesalers and retailers of lead acid batteries to take your old battery for recycling when you buy a new one. Batteries that are covered by the law include batteries



used in vehicles, motorcycles, wheelchairs, boats or other forms of motive power.

Many local retailers accept and recycle lead acid batteries including Advance Auto Parts, AutoZone and other vehicle repair shops. Scrap metal yards such as Bedford Metal Recycling may also pay you for your old battery. Contact your local auto parts store or scrap metal yard for more information.

Tips to Stop Unwanted Robocalls and Avoid Phone Scams

Unwanted calls – including illegal and spoofed robocalls - are the FCC’s top consumer complaint and top consumer protection priority. Robocalls and texts can be annoying, frustrating and - EVEN WORSE - FRAUDULENT. The FCC is committed to protecting you from illegal robocalls, texts and caller ID spoofing. Below are a few tips to assist you with unwanted robocalls and avoid phone scams:

- ① Put your mobile and landline numbers on the national Do Not Call Registry. Visit donotcall.gov or call 1-888-382-1222 from the number you want to register.
- ① Don’t answer calls from unknown callers. That could verify you have an active line. Never call back an unfamiliar number – it may lead to a scam.
- ① Spoofed caller ID numbers may trick you into answering. If you answer a spoofed call, hang up immediately. Do not respond to even simple questions or requests.
- ① Scam callers may pretend to represent an organization, business or even a government agency. Never reveal any personal or financial information unless you can independently verify the caller.
- ① Research apps, services or devices that help block unwanted calls
- ① FCC rules offer protection against unwanted calls and texts. File a complaint with the FCC to help them determine where to take action. Visit consumercomplaints.fcc.gov.

WHAT PLASTICS CAN I RECYCLE?

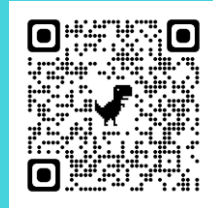
When it comes to plastic, look at the shape!

2022 ROADSIDE CHIPPING

Chipping months are May, July, September and November

Holidays will not change chipping week. Complete rules and a color-coded calendar are available online.

The branch chipping program is for residential use only. It is designed for limb cleanup, and is not for disposal of entire trees. Please follow the below regulations:

1. Limbs should be placed with the cut ends toward the road. Piles should be no more than 2 feet high and 3 feet wide. Limbs can be any length, so long as they are manageable by 1 person. The quantity of debris should take no more than 15 minutes to collect.
2. Limbs should be no larger than 6" in diameter; anything larger will have to be disposed of by the resident or landscaper.



Smaller material shorter than 2 feet in length should be placed in paper yard bags and scheduled for a Friday special pickup.

3. No foreign material; e.g., rope, metal, etc. No stumps or root balls.
4. Thorny branches are not permitted. Place all limbs in the same direction facing the street.

Branch pickup begins the first full week of the chipping month and correlates with your rubbish pickup schedule. To illustrate, if you are a Monday rubbish route, your brush will be picked up for chipping the first full week of the chipping month; Tuesday, the week after, and so forth.

Place branches curbside by 7:00 a.m. the Monday of your chipping week. Due to inclement weather in November, please have branches out no later than November 7.

CAN DROP-OFF

Join in the efforts with our Fire Department to collect aluminum cans to benefit the Aluminum Cans for Burned Children program. Separate aluminum cans (think drinks!) from your regular recycling and then drop them off Monday from 7 a.m. through Friday at 2 p.m. in one of the three blue bins marked with the below logo. Please, no steel, no glass, and no scrap aluminum. Ensure all cans are contained in blue or clear recycling bags. For more information, visit www.acbcoho.org.

CONTAINER RENTAL

The Container Drop-Off Program resumes in April. For a fee, this program allows residents to dispose of large volumes without the hassle of bagging or bundling goods. No contractors are permitted to use this program.

The program operates on a first-come, first-served basis. Residents must reserve a container at least one day in advance.

Container rentals are permitted for one business day. The dumpster will be left overnight, or for a weekend. The container will be dropped off on the driveway only. The resident loads the container, and the Service Department will haul it away.

Residents must select one category from the below. (No mixing of categories.)

1. Construction debris and/or household items
2. Stone
3. Yard debris
4. Small trees (10-12" diameter)
5. Large trees (12"+ diameter)
6. Railroad ties

A consent form is available on our website and must be completed, with payment. This seasonal program runs until the first snowfall.

FRIENDLY FAQs

WINTER REMINDERS

Here are a few reminders for the upcoming season:

Change your furnace filters

Replace your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide batteries

Pepper Pike does not permit snow from a private driveway to be pushed out of drive and across a city street. Make sure your contractor has a snowplow permit from the Building Department

Now is an ideal time to check your mailbox's integrity. Mailboxes in poor condition may not be able to sustain winter weather conditions. Check your post for any signs of rotting prior to the first snowfall. The City will only replace mailboxes free of charge if the plow comes into direct contact with the mailbox. All other mailbox replacements can be made with a Standard Step 2 mailbox for \$155, which includes installation, materials, and removal and disposal of the old unit.

STORM WATER TIPS

The most common cause of a backup is a blockage in the storm sewer lateral lines from the house to the street, which is the resident's responsibility. Make sure your lateral line is inspected by a contractor registered with the City's Building Department.

Keep gutters and downspouts clean and free flowing. Make sure landscaping mounds and planting beds are sloped away from your house. This will help avoid ponding near the foundation of your house.

Keep all exterior drain covers clean of leaves and other debris. Clean out driveway drains at least once per year. Do not pile leaves, branches, or other yard waste in the swale ditches around your property or along the edge of the roadway.

2022 ROADSIDE CHIPPING

Remaining chipping month is November

*Holidays will not change chipping week. A color-coded calendar is
available on our website, under the Service Department page.*

**The branch chipping program is for residential use only. It is designed
for limb cleanup and is not for disposal of entire trees. Please follow
the below regulations:**

1. Limbs should be placed with the cut ends toward the road. Piles
should be no more than 2 feet high and 3 feet wide. Limbs can be any
length, so long as they are manageable by 1 person. The quantity of
debris should take no more than 15 minutes to collect.

2. Limbs should be no larger than 6" in diameter; anything larger will
have to be disposed of by the resident or landscaper.

Smaller material shorter than 2 feet in length should be placed in paper
yard bags and scheduled for a Friday special pickup.

3. No foreign material, e.g., rope, metal, etc. No stumps or root balls.

4. Thorny branches are not permitted. Place all limbs in the same
direction facing the street.

Branch pickup begins the first full week of the chipping month and
correlates with your rubbish pickup schedule. To illustrate, if you are a
Monday rubbish route, your brush will be picked up for chipping the
first full week of the chipping month; Tuesday, the week after, and so
forth.

Place branches curbside by 7:00 a.m. the Monday of your chipping
week. Due to inclement weather in November, please have branches
out no later than November 7.

COMINGLED RECYCLING

In Pepper Pike, residents can recycle these five core items, comingled in a specially designed blue recycling bag: Make sure your items are empty, clean, and dry.

- CANS: Empty and rinse.
- CARTONS: Empty and rinse. Replace the cap.
- GLASS BOTTLES & JARS: Empty and rinse.
- PAPER & BOXES: Flatten cardboard items, like cereal boxes, to save space.
- PLASTIC BOTTLES & JUGS: Empty and rinse. Replace the cap. **Only plastic with a neck (opening narrower than the body) is recyclable.**

Shred Days are free to Pepper Pike residents, including the events at Orange Village. **LIMIT 5 paper bags per event.** No binders, no plastic, no boxes, no magazines, no junk mail, and no newspaper, please. Personal, confidential documents only. Shred Days are largely funded by the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District through the organization's Community Recycling Awareness Grant. The grant is also used to fund the distribution of this newsletter.

FRIENDLY FAQs

- **Recycling and rubbish drop-offs are only permitted Monday from 7 a.m. to Friday at 2:00 p.m. Please pay attention to posted labels, and do not overflow containers. Containers are for residents only. Contractors are strictly prohibited.**
- **Friday special pickups are intended for bulky items only. Please ensure no items are in the same vicinity as your special pickup. There is a limit of six (6) special pickups per calendar year, not including yard waste. Each special pickup is limited to a volume of one standard sized pickup truck.**
- **As the rainy season approaches, it is important to keep your ditches clear of debris.**

CONTAINER RENTALS

The Container Drop-Off Program is currently active. For a fee, this program allows residents to dispose of large volumes without the hassle of bagging or bundling goods. No contractors are permitted to use this program. The program will conclude when weather becomes wintery and resume around mid-April timeframe.

Leaf Reminders

No leaves shall be placed at the curb. Please place all leaves in Kraft paper yard bags and call for a Friday special pickup, or you may use them for backyard composting. When packing biodegradable yard waste bags, do not mingle trash in these bags. These are only for yard debris. Please ensure you or your landscaper does not blow leaves into creeks, culverts, swales, or ditches.

We will be able to pick up your Christmas tree for a Friday special pickup at the curb.

Please be mindful when placing sprinkler systems, shrubs, trees, and rocks in public rights-of-way, to not create a public obstruction.

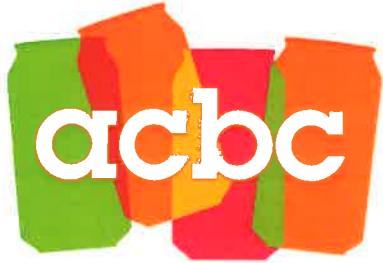

Plastics not only cause intestinal injury and death to fish, but the micro plastics may transfer plastic up the food chain from fish to humans.

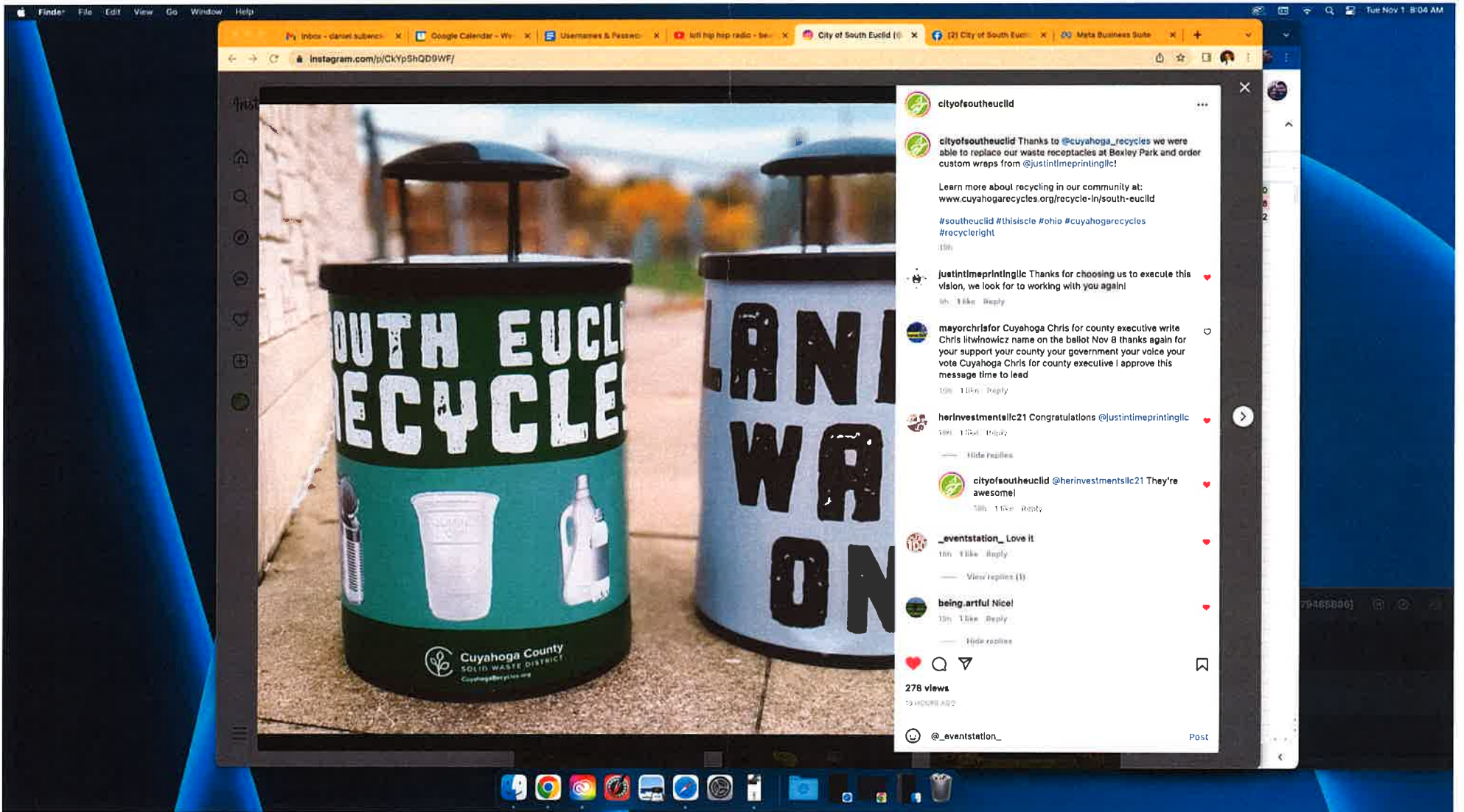

Household Hazardous Waste

The round-ups are for households only, not for waste generated by businesses, schools, churches, charity organizations, camps or other groups. **NOTE: LATEX PAINT IS NOT ACCEPTED** (Paint that can be cleaned up w/ soap & water.)



Materials accepted: oil or solvent-based paint, (no latex paint), varnish, mineral spirits, caustic household cleaners, adhesives, gasoline, sealers, polyurethane, herbicides, automotive fluids, roof tar, lighter fluids, primers and coatings, shellac, pesticides, motor oil, driveway sealer, mercury, paint thinner, turpentine, fungicides, car batteries, kerosene and propane.

Why Do Recycling Rules Change?

Recycling is an industry fueled by environmental responsibility but driven by economics. Recycling rules change over time because recyclables are commodities that are sold and traded throughout the world and subject to market fluctuations.

Strongsville Curbside Recycling: The Need-to-Know

You can include *cans, cartons, glass bottles and jars, paper and boxes* along with *plastic bottles, jugs and tubs* in your curbside recycling. Reduce your waste when you combine *only these items* in your recycling. Recycle better, recycle right.

Brush & Branch Disposal

There Are 2 Ways for Residents to Dispose of Brush:

1. Take brush to the TRANSFER STATION (no charge).
2. Bundle branches in 4-foot lengths and leave out on your regular trash day. Bundles shall weigh no more than 50 pounds each.



WHAT TO INCLUDE CURBSIDE:

Be sure to empty and rinse cans and bottles, replacing cap when necessary and flatten cardboard.

All of these can be placed in a marked container or blue bag. Set out RECYCLING on the opposite side of the driveway from the trash. If your recycling was not picked up or if you are having difficulty with Recycling pick-up, please contact Republic Waste at 440-572-7590. If you notice that a drop-off container is full, please contact us.

WHAT TO PLACE IN THE TRASH:

Not all plastics are recyclable. We no longer refer to the number on the container, because not all numbered items can be recycled. **Plastics like Styrofoam™, plastic cups and utensils, takeout containers and clamshells for lettuce and berries cannot be recycled curbside. Place these items in the trash:**

OTHER RECYCLING:

It's important to recycle correctly. Some items don't belong in your curbside recycling. Many items can be recycled, reused or donated elsewhere.



COMPUTERS

Computer Recycling drop-off Mon. - Fri. 8am-4pm at 16099 Foltz Pkwy at the dock garage doors. Monitors, CPUs, printers, terminals, mice, keyboards, modems, software, cellphones and ink cartridges accepted.



CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS

Consider donating construction materials to Habitat 4 Humanity. Otherwise take to the Transfer Station for disposal for a fee. Mon-Sat ONLY. 572-7590



PLASTIC BAGS

Plastic bags are one of the most common items found in landfills. In an effort to reduce this, Giant Eagle, Heinen's, Marc's and Walmart now offer plastic bag recycling.



SHREDDED PAPER

Shredded paper can make a mess if left curbside. Please place in a tied bag and drop in the River Valley Paper Recycling Bins (located at food bank, parks & fire stations).



CLOTHING & TEXTILES (YOU MUST SCHEDULE PICKUP)

Can be donated to local charities or left in orange bag on curb on normal trash day. For bags/questions, call Simple Recycling 1-866-835-5068 or visit www.simplerecycling.com to schedule pickup.

WHAT NEEDS PROPER DISPOSAL:

Other items require special handling for proper disposal.



BATTERIES

Primary/single-use alkaline batteries can be put in the regular trash. Rechargeable batteries can be recycled for free through local Call2Recycle drop boxes, found in the Apple Store, Best Buy, Home Depot, Lowe's.



LATEX PAINT

Any paint that is LATEX (water clean-up) should be dried out (add kitty litter, sawdust etc.) and placed with the lid off in your regular trash.



FLUORESCENT BULBS

Compact Fluorescent Light Bulbs are accepted at Home Depot, Lowe's.



MEDICATIONS

The Strongsville Police Dept. offers 24/7 drop off for prescription drugs. Pour pills into Ziploc bag & place in dropbox in the Police Station Lobby.



NEEDLES

Place needles in a SHARPS container or heavy duty bottle (i.e. detergent) & mark SHARPS. Take container to the Strongsville Transfer Station for proper safe disposal.
